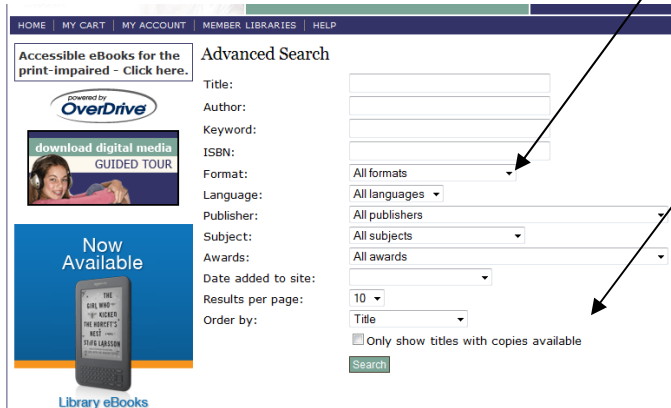


eBook lending to Kindle

To borrow books for your Kindle, you must have an active Amazon account associated with the Kindle. Your Kindle must also be connected to wi-fi or physically connected to your computer via USB cord.

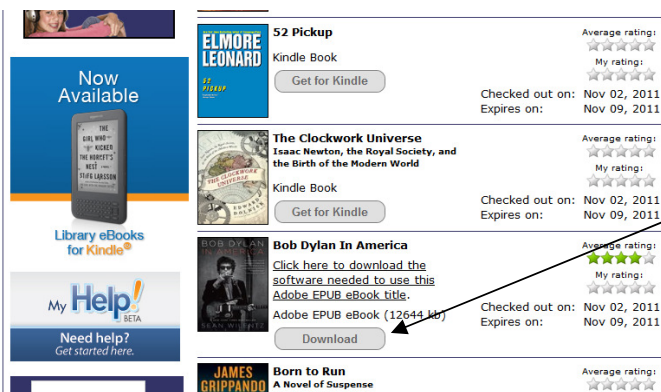
1. Go to UDPL's web site at: udlibrary.org . Hover over "UDPL 24/7" in the blue menu bar and click "Overdrive: download audio & eBooks". This will take you to our Overdrive partner site.
2. Browse or search for books in the Kindle format. You can limit your search to Kindle only books by clicking on



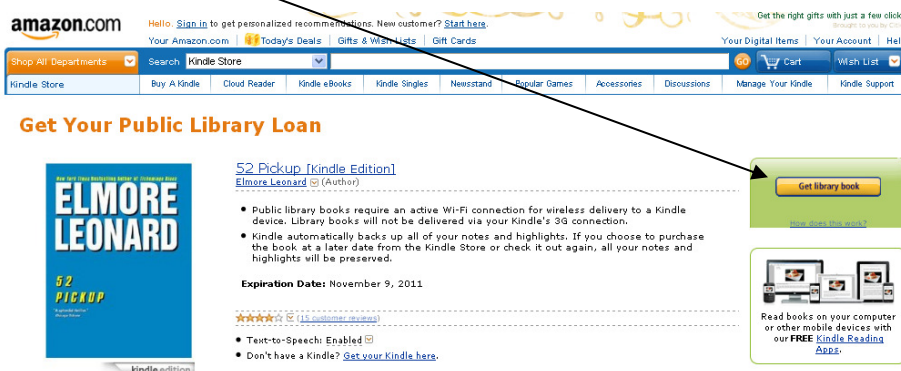
Advanced Search under the regular search box on the left-hand column.

We also recommend that you limit your search to "only show titles with copies available" unless you're looking for something specific.

3. Select and add your items to your cart.
4. Go to my cart, and "Proceed to Checkout". Login to your account with your home library and your library card.
5. Choose your lending period: 7 or 14 days. Click "Confirm Checkout".
6. As the next step, click "Get for Kindle". (Items will be stored in "My bookshelf" should you want to get them later.) Please note in the example below, the Kindle books are listed as "Get for Kindle", whereas "Bob Dylan in America" is listed as "Download" indicating that this is a book that can be read on anything *but* a Kindle.

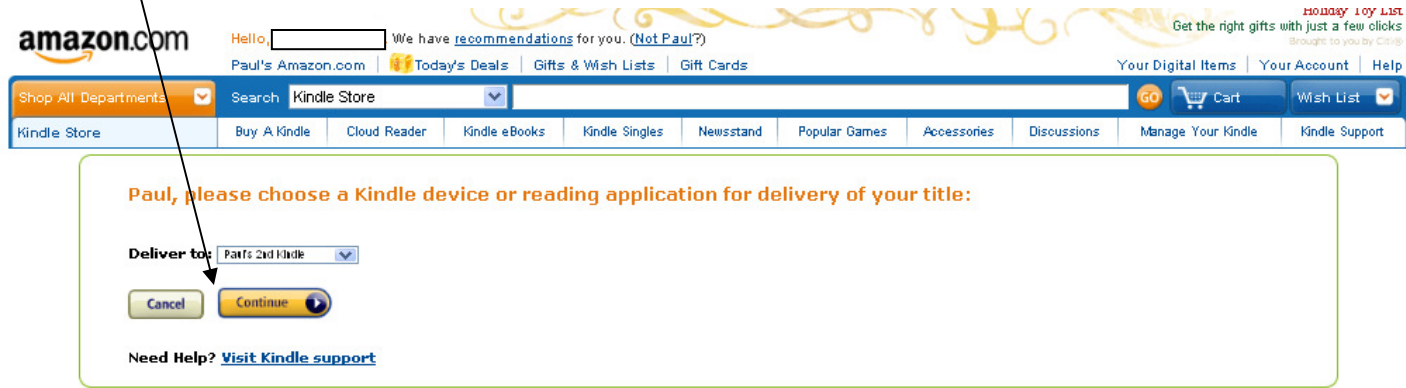


7. Your computer will automatically launch the Amazon website showing your item to be borrowed. Click "Get Library Book"



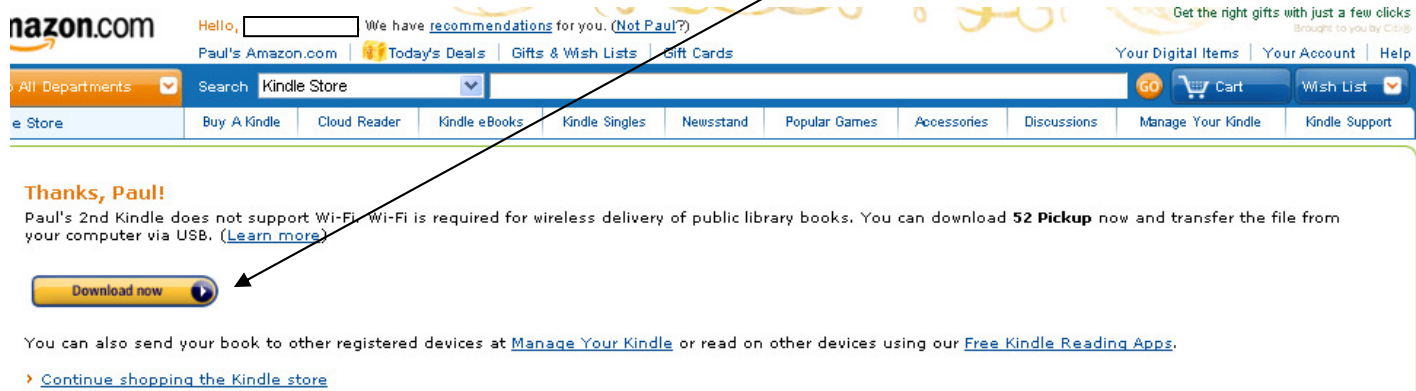
8. Log in to your Amazon account.

9. Your Amazon account will ask you which Kindle you'd like to send your book to. Choose the correct one and click Continue.

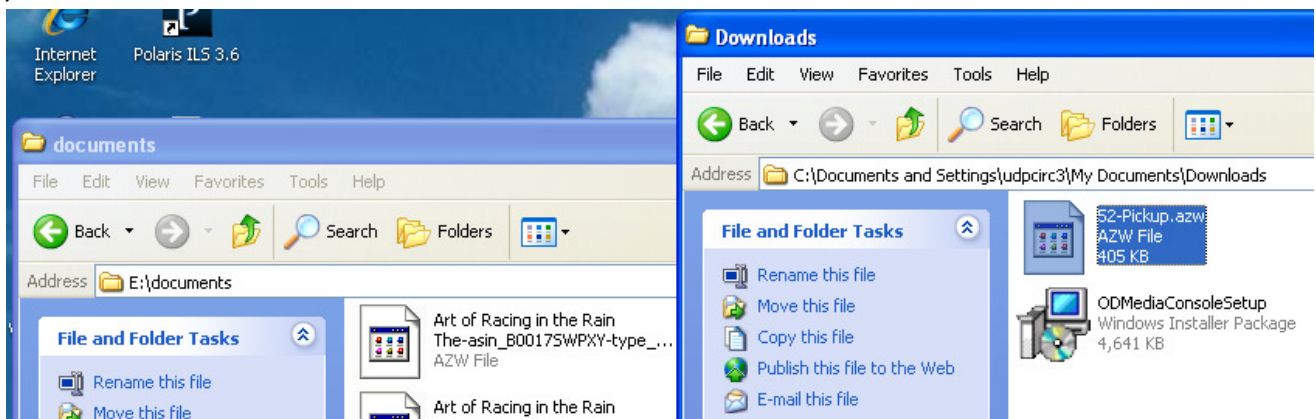


10. At this point, Amazon will either send your book to you via wireless or you can download the document directly if your Kindle does not support wireless. Amazon does not offer library book transfer via 3G, so you must be connected to a local hotspot.

11. To download a book, Amazon gives you an option to download.



12. You may then find the downloaded book on your hard drive and drag and drop it into the Documents folder of your Kindle.



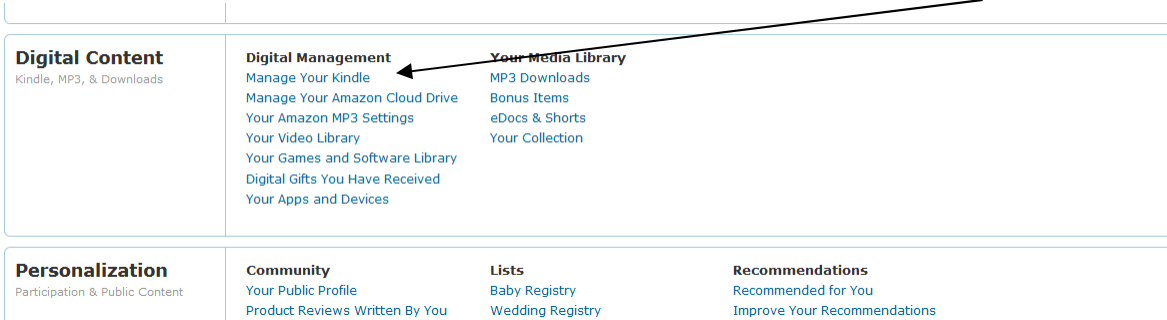
Also:

Kindle compatibility with library eBooks also takes full advantage of Amazon's Whispersync technology. If you check out the eBook again at a later date or choose to purchase the eBook from the Kindle Store, all of your notes, bookmarks and highlights will be preserved. The last page read will also be synced between your Kindle and free Kindle reading apps.

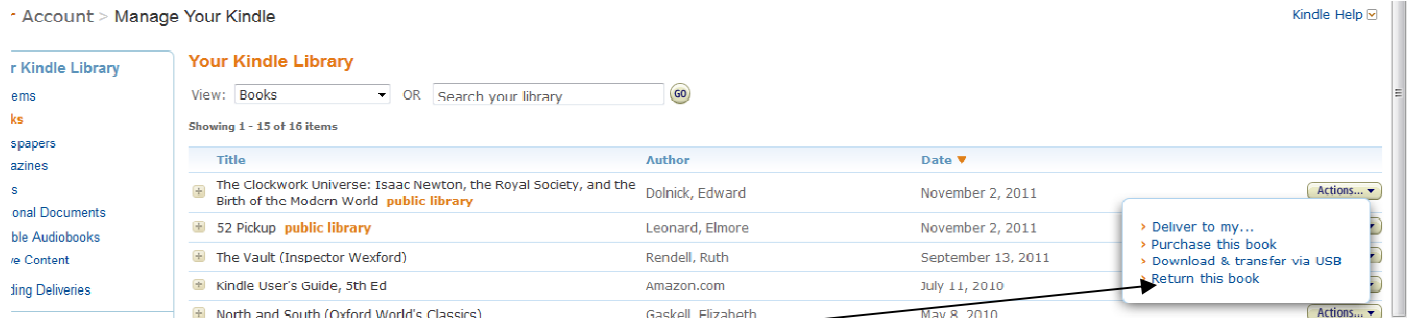
Returning an Kindle book early

Kindle books automatically return themselves, but if you want to return a book early and get another checkout, use the following steps:

1. Log into your Amazon account.
2. Find “Manage your Kindle” under Digital Content (Scroll down) on the My Account page.



3. A list of your items purchase and lent will appear. Public Library items will have “public library” next to them.



4. Click on the Actions drop down next to the book.
